Low testing availability for hospitals Employee vs patient testing



- Current hospital practices
- Ramping up testing availability partnerships with hospitals, private companies, tribal health, National Guard
- As of 8/19, Alaska was the highest per capita in COVID-19 testing compared to any other state
 - Weekly rate of 4.9 tests per 1,000 people

Disparities and Differences Among Vulnerable Populations



- -Resources for clients with community partners
- -Understanding trust of medical model with changing environment
- -Resources available to vulnerable populations



- -Preventing escalation of RMC violations
- -Birth witnesses and transparency
- -Racism and bias
 - How do we protect our most vulnerable patients?



- In 23 states with adequate race/ethnicity data, the cumulative incidence of laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 among AI/AN persons was 3.5 times that among non-Hispanic white persons (CDC, 8/19/20
- Populations who have been experiencing health disparities prior to the pandemic – racial inequity, historical trauma (CDC, 8/19/20)
- Alaska Natives make up a quarter of COVID cases, but only 16% of the population (State of Alaska data)
 - Also more likely to get sick and be hospitalized (State of Alaska data)
