
Maternal Mortality Is Rising in the U.S. As It Declines Elsewhere

Deaths per 100,000 live births











EFM for predicting cerebral palsy it has a false positive rate of 99.8%

EFM is used in 90% of pregnancies in the United States.

Continuous electronic fetal heart rate monitoring was introduced into hospitals in the 1970s without evidence from clinical trials, but with a strong marketing push from the monitoring industry






